

EOTA

- Founded in 1990 under the Construction Products Directive (CPD) as the European Organisation for Technical Approvals (EOTA)
- Continued as of 2013 under the Construction Products Regulation (CPR) as the European Organisation for Technical Assessment
- EOTA is the organisation behind the ETA route to CE marking
 - links all EU Technical Assessment Bodies (TABs)
 - 30+ years' experience in providing technical specifications at an EU scale
 - currently represents 46 TABs designated by Member States (EEA, Turkey and Switzerland) + Observers from LU, NL, UK, US
- For ETAs, manufacturers liaise directly with TABs www.eota.eu/tabs




EOTA's tasks under the CPR

- Coordinate TABs and stakeholders;
- Ensure sharing of best practices;
- Develop and adopt European Assessment Documents (EADs) as a basis for ETAs
- Coordinate procedures surrounding development of EADs
- Inform and advise the EC about EAD matters and improvements based on experience
- Ensure public availability of EADs and ETAs:

(cf. Art. 31(4) of the CPR)



How we are organised







■ Promote trust and transparency in the European construction product market



■ Create consistent technical specifications for the European construction industry while facilitating product innovation and improvement



- Expertise: EOTA provides knowledge and sound technical judgement to construction industry stakeholders
- Cooperation: EOTA enhances collaboration and sharing of best practises among technical partners

- Impartiality: Objectivity is at the core of EOTA's activities
- Confidentiality: EOTA manages the information you provide with the greatest care



Brexit – what it means to the industry

- Settles the question of free circulation of construction products across the Channel
- Huge impact on manufacturers on both sides of the Channel and the TABs/NBs catering to their needs.
- Direction UK > EU
 - No transition rules
 - ETAs and certificates from UK Notified Bodies lost their validity as a foundation for EU conformity procedures and CE marking literally 'overnight'
 - EOTA had already created a route for transferring ETAs issued by UK TABs to EU TABs based on existing documentation. This route remains open.
 - Total of 440 ETA transfers registered so far. The process is well underway.
 - Very smooth transfer thanks to good teamwork among TABs on both sides of the Channel and EOTA




Pathways into the EU

- The EU rules have not changed, but the definition of what the EU is has.
- For standard products
 - Assessment in accordance with hEN
 - Drawing up declaration of performance
 - Affixing CE marking
 - AVCP
- For non-standard products
 - ETA issued by TAB
 - Drawing up declaration of performance
 - Affixing CE marking
 - AVCP



Pathways into the EU – the ETA route




- Available for all non-hEN products
- Easy route in four to five steps, depending on whether new assessment methods are needed
- Agile and customisable
- Allows integration of
 - innovative products
 - new applications (intended uses)
 - novel assessment methods

ETA route benefits


- The ETA is the only route to CE marking and the single European market for nonstandard construction products.
- The ETA route is industry-driven. Manufacturers have a lot of influence on the content of the ETA and/or the underlying EAD.
- The ETA route offers short times-tomarket as well as
- meaningful, customisable performance assessment solutions for manufacturers.
- The ETA provides value to manufacturers in terms of increased sales, market shares, visibility and recognition.






ETA route benefits

- The ETA responds to the needs of professionals and of the authorities.
- The independent assessment performed by TABs helps build customer trust.
- The ETA provides users with reliable product performance information that is comparable across Europe.
- ETAs drive performance-based competition and foster innovation.
- The ETA will play a key role in bringing innovative sustainable and smart products to the internal market quickly.
- With its high international standing, the ETA opens doors worldwide and ensures
 recognition that goes beyond Europe.






Statistics of EADs in EOTA








Statistics of ETAs in EOTA





ETA route overview

- 307 EADs published in the OJEU
- **551 EADs adopted** and valid for issuing ETAs
- 305 EADs in development
- More than 60 EOTA TRs (Technical Reports) published
- 10.050 ETAs issued by Technical Assessment Bodies (TABs)





Pathways into the UK

- ETAs will become UKTAs and the CE marking will be replaced by UKCA and UKNI marking as of January 2023.
- UKTAs can be based on EADs cited before Brexit ... and also afterward.
- Request from the British government to be able to continue referencing EADs cited after Brexit granted by EOTA with the consent of the European Commission
- Prerequisites:
 - EADs need to be cited in the OJEU first (at the request of the EC).
 - UK TABs become EOTA observers and sign Cross Licensing Agreement with EOTA
- The BBA joined EOTA as an observer right after Brexit



EU/UK pathways – practical aspects

- Close cooperation between TABs on both sides of the Channel, both at EOTA level and bilaterally
- Content of ETAs and related technical documentation can be used as a basis for UKTA. Documentation is often shared between EU and UK TABs.
- If you envisage CE and UKCA/UCNI marking, let your TABs know as early as possible so they can plan ahead.
- AVCP: the BBA is willing to accept existing reports (e.g. data from EU NB) regarding AVCP systems 1+, 1 and 2+ (as far as this practice is accepted by the UK government).
- For CE marking, use of EU27 TABs and NBs is mandatory.
- New assessment methods: the UK currently has no counterpart to EOTA.



Outlook

- ETA to UKTA conversion is gaining speed. TABs from both sides of the Channel cooperate closely. Once UKTA is fully operational (2023), we may establish a procedure to convert them into ETAs.
- EOTA is happy to serve as a platform for technical dialogue and exchange between TABs across (the new) EU external borders
- We look forward to strengthening this collaboration and continuing business as before.



Outlook - beyond Brexit: the CPR review

Speed and reliability of EAD delivery


- Clear timelines and responsibilities
- More resources at the EC level
- Fast availability of NB for new ETAs
- Legal demands placed on harmonised technical specifications pending citation

Consistency of the common technical language

- Possibility of horizontal EOTA documents
- Make confidentiality an optional feature
- Avoid duplication of information and declaration duties

Construction works' safety

- Make it easier to include technical minima and recommendations on correct use in EADs and ETAs
- Start with a technically reasonable set of assessment criteria
